

Becoming a Volunteer Trainer

Complete Core Training Modules
Basic Awareness, Foundation and Leadership

Application Process

Complete an Application Form, including the name of a Referee.
Read the Volunteer Policy and return your Volunteer Agreement and Emergency Contact details.

Level One / Level Two

Decide what level of Volunteer Trainer you would like to be.

Level One

Using the online training modules provided by the National Safeguarding Team you will facilitate the training for up to 3 people at one time.

Facilitator Agreement

Complete and return to Safeguarding Team

Online Training Session

Attend a 'Training for Trainers' online session (via MS Teams) to clarify the expectations of the role.

Portal Login Details

Once application and training is complete you will be issued with your own unique Level One Volunteer Trainer Portal Login details. Use these to access the online National Portal and work with participants to complete Basic Awareness or Foundation Safeguarding training.

Level Two

Using the resources provided you will be delivering 'in-person' training to groups of up to 8 people. If you are working with another trained deliverer, you will be able to work with groups of up to 32 people.

Shadow a Diocesan Trainer

Attend an In-Person session being led by a Diocesan Trainer. Follow the session with your own copy of the script, make notes to prepare to deliver the material yourself.

Co-deliver with a Diocesan Trainer

Work together to deliver the training. This may be once, or several times; until you are both confident with your performance.

Observed Delivery

Deliver the training on your own, or with another Volunteer Trainer. You will be observed and 'passed' by a diocesan trainer, as being able to deliver independently.

Deliver Training

Deliver training locally, and keep the Diocesan Team informed so they can keep training records and provide certificates.
